

Business Appointments for the Former Chief Executive of the Committee on Climate Change

Matthew Bell, Chief Executive of the Committee on Climate Change ('CCC') resigned as Chief Executive of the CCC on Friday 14th July 2017. This note outlines the Business Appointment rules which the CCC requires Matthew to follow for a 2 year period following his resignation.

- A two year ban on lobbying Government after leaving the CCC. The lobbying ban does not prevent communications with Government on matters if those communications are an integral part of the normal course of business for an organisation which Matthew may be employed with in the future.

In September 2017 Matthew plans to start employment with Frontier Economics a company, which amongst other activities, provides policy advice to the Government. Therefore the lobbying ban does not prevent Matthew from engaging in communications with Government on policy advice or other such projects in his capacity as an employee of Frontier Economics as this is an integral part of Frontier's normal course of business.

- Frontier Economics should not include Matthew Bell within any teams tendering for research projects with the CCC, or the ASC, for a 6 month period. Where Frontier Economics tenders for research projects with the CCC it is expected that Frontier Economics will ensure Matthew does not contribute towards the project at tender stage. Frontier Economics must obtain the agreement of the Committee should they wish to involve Matthew in the delivery of the project if the tender is successful.
- Matthew Bell must notify the CCC Chairman and the Head of Corporate Services at the CCC prior to accepting any new appointment or employment during the two year period after leaving office.
