Thank you for your request, received on 14 June 2019.

Specifically you requested:

In regards to the 200 individuals and 65 organisations which have agreed to contribute to the third Climate change risk assessment evidence report. I am conducting this research on behalf of a climate change awareness group and I would like to seek the identities of these individuals and organisations for accountability purposes.

Our response:

We are unable to release the names of the individuals contributing to the UK Climate Change Risk Assessment (CCRA) Evidence Report due to restrictions on releasing personal data under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and subject to section 22 of the FOIA (information intended for future publication) on the basis that contributors will be formally acknowledged when the Climate Change Risk Assessment Evidence Report is published in 2021.

I should also note that the list of individuals taking part is changing over time as some individuals are obviously moving jobs over the period that we are developing the CCRA.

We have provided for you below the latest list of the organisations taking part in the assessment. This includes those contributing to the technical chapters, governance groups, stakeholder groups and research projects. At latest count there are 85 organisations taking part.
