## Your request:

On page 139 of The Climate Change Committees annual report, the headline figure of 76MtC02e is used. How was this figure arrived at please? Does this mean that the UK's 28 million homes only produced 76 MtC02e? How does this compare with the Governments estimate of 6 tonnes per annum for the average home?

## Our response:

Thank you for your request which we have handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). Please find our response below.

The headline figure of 76 MtCO<sub>2</sub>e refers to the UK territorial emissions for buildings in 2022, based on the UK Government's 'Provisional UK greenhouse gas emissions national statistics 2022', which are available on the gov.uk website.

Our assessment includes the following 'National Communication Sector' categories in our buildings sector:

- Public: all
- Residential: all except for household composting, accidental fires in dwellings, recreational use of N<sub>2</sub>O, and fluorinated gases
- Business: all except for accidental business fires, miscellaneous industrial/commercial combustion, and N2O use as an anaesthetic

'UK greenhouse gas emissions national statistics' are specifically produced for monitoring of emissions trends. They are a National Statistic, which means they have been assessed by the Office for Statistics Regulation as fully compliant with the Code of Practice for Statistics and are updated regularly.

You referenced "the Governments estimate of 6 tonnes per annum for the average home". This is not a statistic that we are familiar with but if you are happy to share the source of this we would be happy to look into it. However, it is worth noting that the figure in our report covers non-residential buildings as well as houses so not directly comparable.
