#### 1. Conflicts of interest and minutes of previous meeting

The Committee approved the minutes of the previous meeting. There were no new conflicts of interests declared.

#### 2. CB7 sectoral final assumptions – shipping

The secretariat provided an overview of the updated shipping pathway. The Committee discussed different options for assumptions regarding international shipping regulations that might be modelled to assess UK international shipping emissions reductions in the pathway.

#### 3. CB7 sectoral final assumptions – surface transport, land use, removals

On surface transport, the secretariat updated the Committee on the latest EV uptake projections and discussed modelling assumptions for long-term EV costs.

On land use, the secretariat updated the Committee on the level of sequestration from varying the levels of tree planting and detail on the adjusted planting rates per country of the UK.

On removals, the secretariat updated the Committee with revised costings and the Committee gave additional feedback on the timing and scales of different removals approaches.

#### 4. CB7 cross-economy pathway – distributional impact, fiscal impacts and co-impacts

The secretariat updated the Committee on the first pass of distributional impacts, fiscal impacts and co-impacts. The committee discussed modelling assumptions related to amortisation of heat pump costs and gave feedback on the updated policy packages used as input assumptions for modelling.

#### 5. Whole economy costs

The secretariat updated the Committee on the first pass of whole economy costs and savings. The Committee highlighted the importance of recognising costs and savings from the last few decades in any framing. The Committee underlined the importance in the final report of a very clear explanation of how

additional costs are calculated, and where they have changed compared to previous analysis.
